



Appendix A AmeriCorps Position Description: Recovery Coach

Program: Marshfield Clinic Health System AmeriCorps Recovery Corps 1000 Oak St (F1C), Marshfield, WI 54449

Purpose: Members who will undergo training in the Connecticut Community for Addiction Recovery (CCAR) model of recovery coaching and serve as recovery coaches. *Recovery coaches* will focus on reducing prescription drug, opioid, and other substance use disorders through one-on-one contact, outreach phone calls, and community education. Individuals must be in recovery for at least 12 months OR have lived experience (recovery or substance abuse related).

Duties:

- Strengthen the organizations ability to provide coaching services and resources to individuals in need in the community by working directly with individuals (clients) in recovery through direct case management.
 - Support and enhance healthy activities and programming for clients.
 - o Provide regular peer mentorship and engagement.
 - o Engage productively in the health and human services workforce.
 - o Promote long-term recovery for at least 8-10 individuals who are seeking recovery from a substance use disorder and follow the strict guidelines related to coaching ethics.
 - Share lived direct or indirect experience from at least one year of personal experience in recovery from a substance use disorder.
 - o Maintain personal recovery through development of a Recovery Service Plan and routine engagement with host site supervisor and Recovery Corps Program Manager.
 - Develop and monitor personalized Recovery Service Plans for clients based on the Eight Dimensions of Wellness, including spiritual, financial, emotional, physical, environmental, intellectual, occupational, and social.
 - o Transition individual from professionally directed Recovery Service Plan to self-directed management of personal recovery.
 - Work with individuals seeking recovery one-on-one on a weekly basis before, during, and after treatment to:
 - Support recovery
 - Provide education and advice
 - Resolve obstacles to recovery
 - Develop recovery support resources
 - Cultivate sobriety-based habits and social activities
 - Help individuals acquire skills for recovery
 - Provide sober companionship
 - Support connections to mutual aid self-help groups (e.g., Narcotics Anonymous)
 - Assist with identification and resolution of personal and environmental recovery obstacles
- Develop, implement, and promote recovery-focused community education and training opportunities.
- Raise awareness about treatment and recovery for substance use disorders in the community
- Initiate referrals to social service organizations as needed.
- Conduct outreach work with individuals seeking recovery.
- Serve as an advocate for the recovery community.

- Recruit, mobilize, manage, and track volunteers to assist with recovery-focused activities and events
- Act as a resource guide (e.g., mutual aid groups, sober recreation, advocacy groups, sober living, transportation).
- Accompany person to recovery activities.
- Enhance access and reduce barriers to recovery by developing and expanding recovery support services.
- Provide support to community education efforts through their organization.
- Submit accurate records, reports and surveys on time as required by AmeriCorps including clinet contacts and interactions in REDCap, a Member Service Plan, detailed weekly timesheets, quarterly written reflections, volunteer mobilization reports, online data collection reporting, member surveys, and Exit Survey.

Mobilization for disaster response in Wisconsin (optional).

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Ability to provide strong, confidential support to individuals; friendly and outgoing; strong written and verbal communication; competent with a variety of computer and office technology; organized and able to prioritize; maintain a professional and confidential work environment; openness to working with diverse populations and backgrounds; enthusiasm for helping others and willingness to learn.

Other Qualifications: At least 17 years of age by start date; U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident; must satisfactorily pass criminal background checks; possess a high school diploma or GED; commitment to complete the full term of service

Term of Service: September 13, 2021 – August 31, 2022. Full-time positions available.

Time Requirements: Full-time is 35-40 hours/week, 1700 hours total Service is typically scheduled weekdays, between 8am-5pm, with occasional evening or weekend hours, flexibility is key. Final service schedule negotiated with supervisor. Most service occurs either on site or in the community. A portion of time is required for participation in AmeriCorps training, service projects, and events. A minimum of 25 hours/week on average (FT) required to maintain eligibility for living allowance and benefits.

Training:

- Orientation training September 13-17, 2021 at the Wisconsin Lions Camp in Rosholt. Overnights at a residential camp and participation in all training and team building activities required.
- CCAR training required September 28 October 2, 2020. Location TBD.
- Midterm training January 12-14, 2021 at the Kalahari Resort in Wisconsin Dells also required.
- 40+ hours of professional training focused in substance abuse prevention & recovery.
- Face-to-face check-in/mentoring meetings with supervisor weekly.
- Monthly Team Meetings & AmeriCorps training offered online the first Thursday of each month.
- Statewide Opening Ceremony in October (optional) offering a variety of speakers and training.
- Additional topics covered include conflict resolution, career planning, leadership, disaster response (optional) and AmeriCorps policies and procedures.

Benefits:

- A meaningful experience that allows you to learn new skills, take on more responsibility than a typical first job, and engage with your community in intensive and effective ways.
- Bi-weekly living allowance, \$580. Full-time
- Post-service education award, \$6,345. Full-time
- Health/dental/vision insurance plan, premium paid in full by AmeriCorps
- Childcare assistance (income eligible), 80-100% of care costs
- Loan deferment and payment of interest accrued (qualified federal loans)

• Networking opportunities during year of service, and development of references for future employment, graduate school, Peace Corps or scholarships

Evaluation and Reporting: Mid-term and final performance evaluations conducted by supervisor; weekly timesheets; weekly face-to-face check-ins with supervisor; Member Service Plan; quarterly reporting on the number of clients, client progress towards goals, resources and activities.
